Message From the Lake District Trustees

State Legislative and County Leaders tour the progress of Lake Delhi

Several weeks ago, the Lake Delhi Community had the pleasure to take the Governor, Lt. Governor, State Legislative Leaders, County Supervisors and other County Leaders on a tour around Lake Delhi. We shared progress of the newly enhanced public recreational facility at the Turtle Creek Cove and park, Sanitation and Water Quality updates, progress of the Community Fund to rebuild Lake Delhi fund raising efforts, volunteer efforts such as Lake Bed Clean up, and a tour of the Dam site reviewing the progress of Phase 1 and details of what Phase 2 will entail. All of the leaders were impressed with the progress along with seeing first-hand the continued commitment that our local community continues to achieve to restore this treasured public recreational resource. In addition, we let them know that we may need additional help in the future for things such as siltation removal which they were very open to listening to.

Phase 1 Construction Update:

Phase 1 work by Lunda began work in April 2014 and through October 31, 2014, other than the setback in June with the flooding, the project has benefited from ideal weather the rest of the construction season. We have worked closely with Lunda all year to ensure the work was done in an efficient and thorough manner. Lunda has been an excellent contractor for Lake Delhi, bringing their experience to the rehabilitation of all of the concrete portions of the dam bring the structure up to modern standards. They are professional and good team players.

Recent work completed by Lunda includes all concrete

patches on the main structure are done; the new south pier has been poured and the steel forms removed that will be reused on the new south pier; rock bolt anchoring has been completed and backfilled; and electrical demolition has begun inside the powerhouse structure.

Work continues on removing concrete at the south Abutment and placing rebar and forms at North and South Abutments for new Gate and Stop Log Guides. The south downstream Wing Wall rehab patches have been identified and deteriorated concrete removed and new rebar and forms placed and is ready for concrete. Lunda has removed some of the Sheet Pile Shoring at the NW corner of the Powerhouse section of the dam.

Lunda's Phase 1 work is under budget and is projected to remain so. They are well positioned to complete their work in a manner that will easily coordinate with the new Phase 2 contractor once they are in place for the second part of the work to restore Lake Delhi ini 2015. Phase 2 Update:

Recently the Trustee board sent out the Phase 2 bid package. Contractors were asked to respond based on two timing options First: The Final phase two completion date of July 2015 Second: Final phase two completion date of September 2015.

Results: We had a significant amount of interest from a number of contractors with 3 actual bids coming in. None of the bidders responded with an option to have final completion in July of 2015. Two of the three responders bid for a completion of September of 2015 and the other for completion of 2016. The bids received ranged from \$1.3 Million to \$4.1 Million higher than our original Engineer's Estimate of \$6.6 Million.

Trustee Board Decision: After review of the bids and input from Stanley Consultants (Our Engineering Firm) the board made the decision to reject all bids and to move forward with preparations for a re-rebid for Phase two. The Phase 2 bid package will be modified to incorporate possible new methods for obtaining embankment fill material and alternative Cofferdam/ Dewatering specifications. Our goal is to have a revised bid package in the upcoming weeks after

addition soil boring samples are taken shortly. The board felt that since the Phase 2 completion was not going to be complete until the Fall of 2015, that we needed to focus on cost cutting possibilities which will not impact a fall of 2015 completion date.

The rebid of Phase 2 work allows the District to change various components of the previous bid offering to lower costs for the Phase 2 work and go back to market with a more competitive bid offering with a broader group of potential bidders. For instance, since much of the cost overrun in the previous Phase 2 bid letting was in the earthwork items of the project, the District will be able to do the following to bring these costs closer in line with the engineer's estimate: First we will be to identify additional sources of suitable material for both the cofferdam and the permanent dike. New soil borings are being taken in additional areas to find these materials. Secondly, reducing financial risk to the contractors by changing the time of the year that the work would be done from winter weather periods to spring/summer weather periods. The District is also looking into changing the bid to a unit price bidding versus lump sum bidding of the cofferdam and the main dike. The District is also identifying a broader group of contractors to bid Phase 2 work. Finally, our engineer is doing a value engineering analysis to identify the major high cost/low value line items in the previous bid to either change to less expensive options, bid these items as an alternative price that may or may not be accepted in the bid by the District, or eliminate work altogether.

Delaware County Department of Water and Sanitation Letter Being Sent Out to Select Property Owners With Septic Systems Meeting Specific Criteria

Property owners that meet one of the following criteria should expect to receive a letter from Delaware County Department of Sanitation very shortly pertaining to the district Septic System review process being lead by the DNR and Delaware County Sanitation:

- If no information was provided in the original survey process
- If the Septic System is older than 1990
- If the material the Septic System is made of is nonstandard or unknown

The letter will be asking those property owners to obtain the services of a certified time of transfer septic inspector to conclusively determine the type and condition of the septic system. The inspection will consist of opening the septic tank and finding the secondary treatment system (drain field or sand filter). The tank would be inspected and the drain field or sand filter will be tested to see how well it functions. If you have had the septic tank pumped within the last three years you will not need to pump the tank. If not, a tank pump out will be required.

The letters for the selected properties should be arriving this week or shortly thereafter. If you have any questions regarding this process, you can contact:



Thai Pumpkin Soup Recipe

- 3 lbs pumpkin or squash, peeled and roughly chopped
- 4 tsp sunflower oil
- 1 onion, sliced
- 1 tbsp grated ginger
- 1 lemongrass, smashed a little
- 3-4 tbsp Thai red curry paste
- 13.5 oz can coconut milk
- 3.5 cups vegetable stock
- lime juice and sugar, for seasoning 1 red chili, sliced, to serve (optional)

Heat oven to 375F. Toss the pumpkin or squash in a roasting tin with half the oil and seasoning, then roast for 30 mins until golden and tender. Meanwhile, put the remaining oil in a pan with the onion, ginger and lemongrass. Gently cook for 8-10 mins until softened. Stir in the curry paste for 1 min, followed by the roasted pumpkin, all but 3 tbsp of the coconut milk, and the stock. Bring to a simmer, cook for 5 mins, then fish out the lemongrass. Cool for a few mins, then blend until smooth with a hand blender, or in a large blender in batches. Return to the pan to heat through, seasoning with salt, pepper, lime juice and sugar, if it needs it. Serve drizzled with the remaining coconut milk and scattered with chili, if you like. ENJOY!!


sitting on his lap, commanding the controls but the speed limit was always strictly enforced. Much to the


