Message from the IDNR

ORANGE INSPECTION TAGS. Many of you have noticed orange inspection tags on docks along with a letter covering the common delinquencies. Perhaps your dock was one of those tagged. These notices were courtesy notices prior to full enforcement of the dock rules beginning August 1st, 2018.

By August 1, every dock structure on the lake should be signed with the dock's 911 address and the dock permit number. Properties with more than one dock must have a sign on each structure. Every sign shall be installed at the water's end of the dock and each sign must be readable. The vast majority of inspection tags were attached to docks that violated one of the signage rules.

Other violations tagged during June and July inspections included:

Hoists with hard roofs

Improperly permitted docks (dock permits that were invalid because the permit didn't cover the actual number of docks or boat hoists/lifts/slips/racks on the water)

Improper spacing

Dock structures with less than 10 feet of open space between them and the neighboring dock

Hoists not attached to docks or not permitted and signed as a separate structure

Illegal dock configurations Docks without a dock permit

All dock permits must be applied for and managed online. Additionally, you must Update your permit before you modify any portion of your dock structure or add any additional hoists or mooring spaces. If you have a Class 1 dock permit, you cannot add a third hoist or slip until you update your permit to Class 3.

Beginning August 1, the Iowa DNR will fully enforce the dock rules. If your dock is not in compliance, regardless of whether or not you have received an inspection tag earlier, you will receive a citation. If the owner of the dock cannot be identified by DNR staff, the property owner will receive the citation. Make Sure You and Your Neighbors are on the Lake Delhi Weather Text Alert System

The Dam Operations Team has developed a weather alert system for the Lake Delhi district. Those who enroll will get a text alert on their cell phone notifying them of weather events that could affect the lake area any time during the year. We currently have over 400 residents signed up for this service. If you have not enrolled and wish to do so, please submit your name, cell phone number, and carrier (ex. US Cellular, Verizon, Sprint, etc.) to lakedelhitrustees@lakedelhi.org. It's important to understand that weather events can have differing effects depending on where you live on the lake and you need to take that into consideration. We recommend that you and your neighbors have a plan for any emergency weather event before it happens.

Did You Know This About Lake Delhi?

The original Lake Delhi dam was constructed in 1928 by Interstate Power Company to produce electricity for our part of rural Iowa. Our dam is similar to a large number of other dams in Minnesota and Wisconsin known as low head hydro dams. They were built between 1900 and 1938 on rivers in this region. Low head dams are generally less than 50 feet high and are able to pass relatively high volumes of river water. The vast majority of these dams are in Wisconsin but there are a few in Minnesota and Iowa. So when our dam was built in 1928, this was nothing new to people who knew how to build these types of dams. The technology had been developed for a generation before we took our turn to build a dam.

Our dam is well suited for its location on the Maquoketa River geologically and hydraulically. The dam was build on solid bedrock which is located in a narrow portion of the river valley.

Part of the 2010 rebuild project was to investigate and repair the 1928 construction that did not

meet modern engineering standards. This work was done in 2014 as during Phase 1 construction by Lunda Construction of Little Chute, Wisconsin. Every square foot of the concrete surfaces in the powerhouse portion of the dam was checked for soundness. We were pleasantly surprised that very little repair needed to be done to the existing concrete structure.

The 1928 concrete powerhouse sits solidly on a sedimentary rock formation. To ensure no leakage under the existing concrete structure, masonry grout was injected under very high pressure to fill any cracks that may be present in the rock formation.

The front of the entire powerhouse was rock bolted into the bedrock below. This was because the modern structural factor of safety against the dam tipping over was increase by 50% since 1928. Even though the existing powerhouse had not tipped over in the past 80 years, this was work that had to be done to meet the requirements of the permit. (No kidding)

Our original 1928 dam was well built be people who worked hard and knew what they were doing, The rebuild project in 2010 ensured the concrete structure was still structurally sound, wouldn't leak water under the structure and met the current safety standards for dams. You could say that the dam was built twice by people who worked hard and knew what they were doing. We have a great dam to enjoy for generations to come.

Recap on Septic Awareness Day—from Delaware County Sanitation Dept.

We held Septic Awareness day for the residence in the lake Delhi area on Saturday June 2nd. After a week of hot weather, it was a beautiful day at Baileys Ford Park. We were hoping to have more concerned residence there but those who attended had many good questions for or group of speakers. Dennis Lyons welcomed all for attending and introduced the other speakers and other the installers who attended. He touched base on the fact that we are gaining, but need to keep going forward. He mentioned that there are many solutions out there for the tough areas but will work with as much as possible to work best answer.

The first people to speak were from CR Winnpump, they are suppliers for a couple of the advanced systems available in Iowa which we have local installers who are capable to put these systems in. The first is Waterloo Bio-filters. We do not have any in the county at this time but it looks like it has possibilities. The other system they have is Premier techs Eco-Flo we do have several of them around the area and have a little bit of maintenance but are very reliable around the United States. Trenton Pohl from Iowa Water and Waste Systems based out of Des Moines. He spoke of the Advantex system which we also have several of those around the county. This is a very good system and needs a maintenance agreement. This system will contact the contractor automatically with any issues it is having. It has been around a long time and with proper maintenance and care, it is trouble free.

We finished of the guest speakers with Curt Cluckey who talked of the more basic systems for soil treatment, which is what we try to do when possible. He also talked of a product that has been around for a long time that we do not need rock and pipe called easy-flow manufactured by infiltrator. He also handed out pamphlet on do's and don'ts of what should go into the septic tank. We would like to thank all who attended!

Do Your Part, Be SepticSmart:

The Do's and Don'ts of Your Septic System

Learn these simple steps to protect your home, health, environment and property value:

Do:

 Have your system inspected (in general) every three years by a licensed contractor and have the tank pumped, when necessary, generally every three to five years.

Don't:

- Pour cooking grease or oil down the sink or toilet.
- · Rinse coffee grounds into the sink.
- Pour household chemicals down the sink or flush them.

Do:

- Eliminate or limit the use of a garbage disposal.
- Properly dispose of coffee grounds & food.
- Put grease in a container to harden before discarding in the trash.

Don't:

 Flush non-degradable products or chemicals, such as feminine hygiene products, condoms, dental floss, diapers, cigarette butts, cat litter, paper towels, pharmaceuticals.

Do:

Dispose of these items in the trash can!

Don't:

- Park or drive on your drainfield. The weight can damage the drain lines.
- Plant trees or shrubs too close to your drainfield, roots can grow into your system and clog it.

Do:

 Consult a septic service professional to advise you of the proper distance for planting trees and shrubs, depending on your septic tank location.

Don't

 Concentrate your water use by using your dishwasher, shower, washing machine, and toilet at the same time.
 All that extra water can really strain your septic system.

Do:

- Stagger the use of water-generating appliances. This can be helpful especially if your system has not been pumped in a long time.
- Become more <u>water efficient</u> by fixing plumbing leaks and consider installing bathroom and kitchen faucet aerators and water-efficient products.
